President's Report

I am privileged to present the presidents report for the 2023/24 season, my first as president. We certainly operate in a 12 month never ending cricket season, as we start preparation for the following season well before the last ball of the current season.

This time last year in July 2023, we were working through the commencement of PlayHQ to the cricket community throughout Victoria. Cricket Victoria had delayed the implementation by 12 months so issues could be resolved before we commenced using the new system. I can categorically say this was the biggest test we faced as an organisation and so did the clubs as we learnt how to use the new system with the support of Cricket Victoria staff especially Nick Brimacombe and Dale Wain and they should be congratulated for the time and effort they put into associations and clubs to assist them. No doubt there is still some challenges to work through with PlayHQ and we will continue to work with CV to ensure that improvements and enhancements are built into the system.

There is not a day goes by when there is not something happening either on or off the field that doesn't require attention and work and therefore that is why there is a requirement for us to employ full time staff who go over and above their duties to make sure our competition in the best possible position it can be dealing with fixturing and ground issues, rules and by-law interpretations, weather, player points, councils, clubs and umpire requests etc, so a special thanks to Mark Rainey and Nick Macmillan for their efforts over the season just gone.

I would like to particularly thank Mark who steps down after 3 years as our general manager and well over 20 years on the executive. His leadership, work effort, commitment, and determination to work for the betterment of the competition is outstanding and this will never be replaced. From a personal view, he will certainly be missed, but he has had a great innings with SECA both on and off the field and you can now relax while the work continues.

As we farewell Mark, we welcome Nick Macmillan to the general manager role and he will continue to work with and support the clubs moving forward in the same manner as Mark has done.

I would like to thank all the members of our Executive who devote their time and effort to ensure the competitions runs as smoothly as possible. We have over 15 sub-committees that each of our board are allocated to and they all fulfill their duties to a high level.

Tracey Fletcher will be stepping down from the committee and I would like to thank her for her efforts across a number of sub-committees over the 15 years she has been on the executive, so thanks and well done Tracey.

I would also like to thank all our volunteers at our clubs who devote so may hours to their clubs both at senior and junior level that players can play cricket at the level that suits them.

This season Andrew Collison replaced Benny Goodman as our Umpires Advisor and I would like to thank him for his efforts this season where pleasingly we saw an increase in the numbers of umpires including a number of 1st year umpires under the direction of our Umpires Association led by President Steve Laffan and Secretary Joel Lefkovic and we continue to work closely with them.

Our season commenced on Saturday 7th October for our Shield grades and over the next 2 weeks our Standard and Reduced grades as well as our juniors commenced their season. Fortunately, our seniors were not affected by rain early in the season, but we did miss 2 weeks in December through rain. We were not affected by heat at all during the home and away season.

The 1st weekend of finals were played and teams won and lost. As we prepared for the 2nd week of finals which is the grand finals for our Reduced grades, the forecast temperature for both Saturday and Sunday continually were increasing. Therefore, Saturday was heated off and with the forecast for Sunday would have resulted in a heated off, we made an unprecedented decision to start the games early on Sunday morning to avoid the heat and for the betterment of the competition as a whole. All games were successfully completed by around 2:00pm, before the maximum temperature was reached and premierships were decided in the reduced grades.

The following weekend premierships were won in the Shield and Standard grades including some thrilling finishes to many of the grand finals in a weekend that I can say was one of best weekends we have experienced in SECA in recent years.

General Manager's Report

Completing my third and final season as the inaugural SECA General Manager, it was once again an honour to perform this role for the SECA community. The relationships I have established with all our clubs, fellow SECA executive members and the SECUA have certainly helped me perform this role and I thank you all sincerely. A special mention goes out to the new SECA executive team extremely well lead by Simon Poll and Peter Kemp as President and Vice President respectively in their first years in these very important roles.

The Seniors competition started with two new clubs in SECA, being the Glendiators CC as well as a restructured Melbourne Hellenic CC and both clubs performed excellently both on and off the field.

We lost nine Senior teams from the previous season but picked up six new teams as well.

A major off field focus for SECA pre-season was the recruitment of new Umpires, and along with new SECA exec member Harry Stamos, and SECUA Secretary Joel Lefkovic, we formed a subcommittee and with advertising and marketing, we had a great uptake of potential new Umpires.

However once we had the names, we needed to ensure they would be capable to perform in our matches and that is where new Umpires coach and adviser Andrew Collison did a great job in his new role. Whilst not all applicants made the cut, we did have a 50% increase in Umpires for this season which was a fabulous result.

Well done to Le Page Park for taking out our Longmuir Premiership in a very close win over Bentleigh ANA who also had a sensational year to finish on top after the Home and Away games coming up from Woolnough Shield the previous season.

Congratulations to West Bentleigh coming from fourth on the ladder to win three consecutive finals and be Premiers in Woolnough Shield thus being promoted to Longmuir Shield for the upcoming season.

Also well done to Quiney Shield Premiers Omega who have dominated that Grade for the last few years, and they finally got their rewards for all that effort.

Finally whilst discussing Premiers, well done to Highett West and Southside East Caulfield Cricket Clubs for their first eleven teams tasting Premiership success this year also for the first time in many years.

The introduction of PlayHQ and OfficialsHQ was a major challenge for our Association this season, but overall we all did pretty well getting our heads around the new computer systems. We are currently in discussions with Cricket Victoria and people from PlayHQ to address issues we and clubs have encountered and hopefully many of them will be addressed which will make life easier for everyone next season.

We distributed another Club Survey to clubs in March, to help us plan for the 24/25 season. Thank you for your feedback and it was the first time we got 100% response from all SECA Senior Clubs, and we will certainly use that data to help construct next season.

The new SECA General Manager, Nick Macmillan, will begin working on August 1st, and I will assist him during a handover period to help him acclimatise in his new role. I trust the SECA community will fully support Nick, on what can be a very challenging role at times throughout the year.

Treasurer's Report

The financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2024 are presented to members showing a loss for the year of \$21,914 (2023 profit of \$117).

Income for the year increased by \$14,489 mainly due to player fees. The introduction of PlayHQ and the need for all players to register has provided a streamlined method for Cricket Victoria, associations, and clubs to charge a fee for their services. SECA introduced a small player fee for the 2023/24 season to trial the robustness of the system, and it proved to be an effective and efficient way to charge for our services. Based on this, and the experience of other sporting associations, SECA is moving to a fully player based rather than a team based registration model for 2024/25.

Expenses increased by \$36,520 mainly due to administration fees. Like many other cricket associations, SECA has found that the demands of running a large association are too demanding for a volunteer organisation, and therefore engages professional sporting administrators to run our association. Fortunately, the association is in a strong financial position, and this has enabled the executive to introduce this change whilst keeping charges to clubs low in comparison to other associations. Feedback from clubs on the standard of the administration of the association have been very positive.

At a club level, costs continue to rise, and this will put pressure on both clubs and their players. Local councils are increasing charges, Play HQ imposes charges, and umpire fees are a large cost for higher graded teams and teams in finals. SECA attempts to keep any increases in its charges to a minimum, however the trends indicate that charges will need to increase in the medium term.

To conclude, I would like to thank the rest of the Executive for their assistance and hard work, and Club Treasurers for their co-operation during the season.

In my third year as Junior Manager, we were able to streamline a few key areas, with this aimed to continue to progress in future seasons, with the feedback received from our member clubs, at the recent junior's forum.

The Junior sub-committee was a well-oiled machine, with many thanks to Matt Balmer, the experience of Phil Arnold & valuable input from junior volunteers in 'club-land', special mention to Kim Pitt for his overseeing of the SECA representative program. Thanks also to our continued efforts of the newly formed 'junior working group', made up of experienced junior club personnel. Umpire's & Coach Report

After 16 years of Brian "Benny" Goodman coaching the SECA umpires, Benny thought it was time for a break and a new voice. I want to start by thanking Benny, first of all for his performance in the last 16 years where I, among a host of SECA umpires, have learned so much, and for Benny, both endorsing me and supporting my appointment into the role.

Umpiring in SECA, as with all cricket competitions, is difficult and getting umpires into these roles has proven to be difficult in recent seasons. The SECA executive have recognised this and have been strong supporters of our drive to get more members into our ranks. Innovative recruiting strategies like, social media, letter drops and appealing to the clubs has seen a large uptake of recruits, swelling our numbers from mid 20s in season 2022/23 to nearly 50 umpires this season.

One of the issues I wanted to address was the attendance of umpires at SECUA meetings this year. I'm pleased to report that the numbers at the meetings this year were consistently high, and I believe, the highest attendances we've had in my time as an umpire. This allowed me, as a coach, to address as many of the umpires as possible to give them up to date coaching in specialised subjects, i.e.: - LBWs, Caught Behind, Run Outs etc but more importantly, contemporaneous feedback from the captain's reports. The same issues continue to arise and by constantly addressing these and emphasising their importance to the umpires, we are continuing to improve.

When it comes to improvement, we have taken huge strides forward in our performance. In all, 14 umpires officiated in Longmuir Shield games this year. It would've been 16 except for the unavailability of two of our umpires when they were in a position to be appointed. This hasn't been done purely as a rotational experiment, it has been done based on performance and ratings by the captains and our match-day observations.

My role is expanded on what Benny did as I have also incorporated an observer role into my coaching/advisor role. This has seen me attending up to five games on any given Saturday to give on-the-spot feedback to our umpires as well as speak directly to the captains whose ratings play such a big role in our appointments. My observations have generally been restricted to our new umpires and as a result I haven't attended many Shield grade games. On the occasions I have, I've been very impressed with the performance of our Shield grade umpires and the feedback I've received from captains and officials at these games has backed that up.

I did get the opportunity to observe all of our final's appointed umpires in the last two weeks of the season. My takeaway from these matches and particularly the Grand Finals I attended was that our umpires were largely forgettable. This of course is a compliment of the highest order. We are basically there to hold their hats and count to 6. The sign of a good performance by an umpire is that the players don't remember who did the job.

Our umpires were challenged this year when it came to weather and ground conditions. In one of the home & away rounds this year we had terrible conditions which may have seen umpires take players from the field, but full credit to all of our umpires who managed to get a game of cricket through to its conclusion in this particular round.

The selection of our umpires for the finals this season was a huge challenge based on the excellent reports and performances of our umpiring panel. Those selected for the grand finals in particular should be proud of their efforts and I congratulate each of them on their seasons.

I want to take a moment to pay respect to Stanley Goodman. Stan performed the role of umpire's observer when the role was first devised and did so to a very high standard, supplying feedback to our umpires on the spot and to Benny in his role as coach. Sadly, Stan passed away this season and my thoughts and condolences go to his brother Benny and his family.

I want to thank Simon Poll, Mark Rainey and the SECA executive for giving me this opportunity, one which I have thoroughly enjoyed. Their support throughout the season has been unwavering. Mark and I have worked closely this year to get the appointments right, based on performance, geography and encouraging our new umpires to strive to umpire in as a high a grade as they possibly can.

I also want to thank Steve Laffan, Joel Lefkovic and the SECUA committee for their support in my first season in this role. The attendance numbers at meetings are a credit to their efforts and hard work.

In my previous role as president of the SECUA, we identified the issue of Umpire's accreditation as being a sticking point with our members who didn't know where they stood in respect to this. I know that Benny constantly hit a brick wall when trying to deal with Cricket Victoria with this issue. This season I was keen to remedy the situation in my new role. What I can say now is that all members of our umpiring panel have their accreditation and Working With Children Certificates (WWC) up to date. What I can't do though is take all the credit. This in fact goes to Penny Keaughran, SECUA's latest committee member who not only took on the role of accreditation officer but did it to such an incredible level that we, SECUA, are the only association in Victoria to have 100% compliance. Thankyou Penny for your great work.

I will be continuing in my role for season 2024/25 and look forward to working with SECA, SECUA and all our umpires on continuous improvement and making the game of cricket enjoyable for everyone involved.
